Direction to all Contractors:	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Clean Work Areas All Contractors are responsible for cleaning their work areas regularly and at the end of each day to prevent hazards. All waste, debris, and materials must be safely disposed of in the provided bins or rubbish receptacles.Waste Disposal and Materials Handling<ul style="list-style-type: none">Excess Materials: Full lengths of material must be stacked neatly beside the rubbish area for recycling.Immediate Cleanup: If a work area is unsafe due to waste or debris, a Coral Homes Representative may request immediate cleaning. Non-compliance can result in a safety risk and potential penalties.Rubbish Removal Bins or cages will be provided by Coral Homes for waste disposal. If the site is not kept clean and safe, Coral Homes will arrange for cleanup at the Contractor's cost. By maintaining a clean and safe site, we help protect everyone's health and safety. Please ensure you follow these guidelines to prevent accidents and immediately address safety concerns when requested by Coral Homes Representatives.
